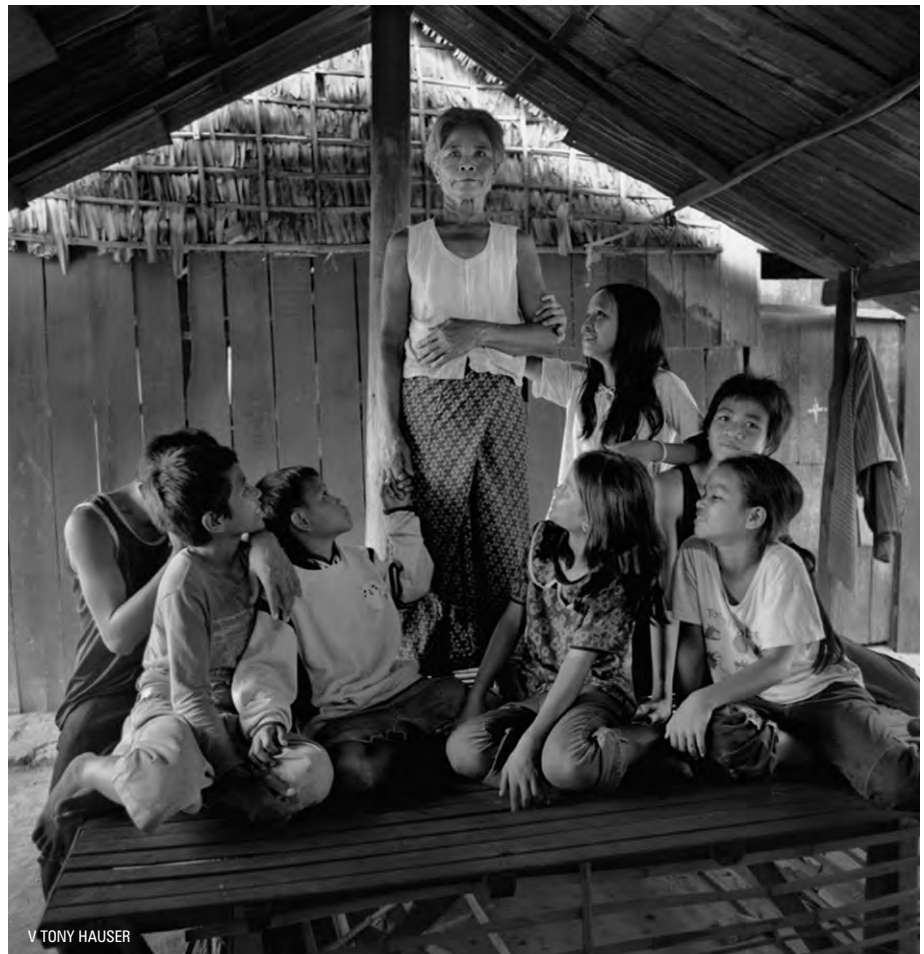

Lisa Forman is a post-doctoral fellow working on human rights, trade and access to medicines in developing countries. Through a fellowship from CIHR and the Comparative Program on Health and Society at the Munk Centre for International Studies, Forman will explore theoretical and practical methods of ensuring more rights-compliant trade rules on medicines, including the domestic use of a right to health impact assessment. The postdoc is supervised by Professor Ronald Labonte at the University of Ottawa and Professor Jillian Clare Cohen at the University of Toronto. Forman completed her SJD at the University of Toronto Faculty of Law in 2006 on the role of human rights in increasing access to AIDS medicines, focusing on the case study of South Africa.
